La presente selección de artistas ofrece un recorrido por una diversidad de mundos visuales y ofrecen un panorama amplio de cómo identificarse como artistas y hacer comunidad, proponiendo nuevas formas de hacer, pensar y vivir en conjunto. Estos artistas, de distintas generaciones y contextos culturales, rompen barreras físicas y simbólicas, abriendo espacios nuevos para pensar en cómo relacionarse con el mundo. A través de diversas prácticas que incluyen la pintura, la escultura, el performance, la instalación y la moda, nos invitan a reflexionar sobre futuros más dinámicos, inclusivos y expansivos, donde la multiplicidad de realidades posibles se hace visible.

Ofelia Rodríguez fusiona objetos encontrados y elementos simbólicos para crear composiciones surrealistas y cargadas de humor, a través de las cuales explora la identidad cultural, los estereotipos de género y su conexión con sus raíces colombianas.

This selection of artists offers a journey through a diversity of visual worlds and provides a broad panorama of how to identify oneself as an artist and build community, proposing new ways of creating, thinking, and living together. These artists, from different generations and cultural contexts, break physical and symbolic barriers, opening new spaces to think about how to relate to the world. Through various practices, including painting, sculpture, performance, installation, and fashion, they invite us to reflect on more dynamic, inclusive, and expansive futures, where the multiplicity of possible realities becomes visible.

Ofelia Rodríguez fuses found objects and symbolic elements to create surreal compositions laden with humour, through which she explores cultural identity, gender stereotypes, and her connection to her Colombian roots.

(Colombia. 1946–2023)

Ofelia Rodríguez es una de esas figuras atrapadas entre culturas. Creció en el Caribe colombiano pero acabó desarrollando su carrera en el extranjero. Su obra se caracteriza por un firme interés en mostrar sus raíces tropicales latinas, siendo totalmente consciente de los clichés que conllevan y mezclándolos con temas de género en un lenguaje muy humorístico y pop. Realizó sus estudios en la Universidad de Los Andes a finales de los sesenta y cursó un máster en la Universidad de Yale y algunos estudios en Pratt, así como en París donde en 1978-1979 mostró sus primeros ensamblajes, cajas mágicas, que utilizan juguetes, símbolos religiosos, relojes y objetos de uso cotidiano. A través de su obra Rodríguez crea una simbiosis de la artista que abandona su origen local, y construye una fuerte caracterización del latino en el extranjero, para confirmar su existencia y utiliza intencionadamente el estereotipo de sí misma para dominar su propuesta creativa.

Sus pinturas y cajas involucran fuertes simbologías de lo femenino y lo masculino en su país natal: la condición machista frente a la mujer frívola que subyace en la cultura cotidiana de Colombia. La artista, que se trasladó muy pronto a Londres, exacerbaba esta retórica visual a través de su obra como una forma de retratar su país desde el extranjero, desde una cultura a la que no pertenece. Es como un manifiesto, una forma obstinada e irónica de gritar: Vengo de la tierra del paraíso, de lo salvaje y del realismo mágico, pero siempre con algo más reflexivo que yace más allá de lo obvio.

Ofelia Rodriguez is one of those figures caught up in between cultures as she grew up in the Colombian Caribbean but ended up evolving her career abroad. Her work is characterized by a firm interest in showing her latin tropical roots, being completely conscious of the clichés they involve and mixing them with gender issues in a very humorous and pop language. She did her studies in Universidad de Los Andes in the late sixties and did her masters degree at Yale University and some studies in Pratt, as well as in Paris where in 1978-1979 she showed her first assemblages, magical boxes, that use up toys, religious symbols, clocks and daily use objects. Through her work Rodriguez creates a symbiosis of the artist leaving her local background, and builds a strong characterization of the latino abroad, to confirm her existence and intentionally uses the stereotype of herself to master her creative proposal.

Her paintings and boxes involve strong symbolologies of the feminine and masculine in her native country: the macho condition vs. the frivolous women that lie in the everyday culture of Colombia. The artist, who moved early on to London exacerbates this visual rhetoric through her work as a way to picture her country from abroad, from a culture where she doesn't belong. It is as a manifesto, a stubborn and ironic way to scream: I come from the land of paradise, wildness and magical realism, but always with something more reflective lying beyond the obvious.




